### The Voice of Girls and Women Workshop

The Voice of Girls and Women Workshop held, on December 12,2023, at Harmony Hotel Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, it was a significant event, aimed to amplify the voices of girls and women in IDP centers.

The workshop attracted participants from various organizations such as the House of Peoples of Representatives, Disaster Risk Management Commission, Ministry of Peace, regional government offices, UN Women, Child Fund, World Vision, IDP center representatives, and journalists from mainstream mass media.

During the workshop, participants had the opportunity to view a powerful short documentary film that showcasing the voices of Ethiopian IDP girls. This film left a strong emotional impact.

Additionally, presentations focused on policy briefs and assessments of the psychosocial support needs of IDP girls. A panel discussion was held to address policy recommendations.

Furthermore, a discussion was conducted on situational analysis research findings, and which highlighted the challenges faced by girls in IDP centers and opportunities for improvement.

ESD's Youth Skill Development and Job Creation program that aims to develop the skills of young individuals and create job opportunities in different regions.

The organization has successfully transformed the lives of numerous youths by equipping them with lucrative skills, enabling them to become self-sufficient and support their families.

One remarkable initiative by ESD is the Sidama Coordination office's Youth skill training and Job creation effort. Over a period of three months, 23 enthusiastic youths 19 females and 4 males, underwent comprehensive training that encompassed not only Cooking skills but also essential life skills such as Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) and Drug Effect.

The culmination of their hard work was celebrated on December 28, 2023, at Hawassa Combony College where the training was conducted.

The graduation ceremony marked a significant milestone for these graduates who have successfully completed the training program and are now ready to embark on their professional journeys.

As another advantage, upon completing their training, these trainees were awarded certificates of completion. These certificates serve as a valuable asset, enabling them to secure loans from financial institutions, participate in enterprises, and ultimately, achieve success.

To enhance their understanding provided them with essential entrepreneurship, business plan, sexual and reproductive health (SRH), and life skills training over four consecutive days.

Following the completion of their training, graduates were granted apprenticeship opportunities, allowing them to gain invaluable real-world experience in their respective fields. To ensure the quality of this training, we provided necessary training inputs such as poultry and sheep feeds.

Furthermore, the Certificate of Competency (COC) has been granted to an impressive 97 graduates in the fields of Catering, Sheep fattening, Poultry production, Males' Beauty Salon, and Tailoring.

## **Empowering Youth Groups** and Unleashing Potential

In the spirit of fostering growth and empowering our youth, we are excited to share some fantastic updates from our JV project.

As we continue to invest in our youth, we have collaborated with SMART Career Consulting PLC to provide pre-job linking training for 20 graduates. This training aims to help these dedicated individuals find and secure their dream jobs, while also strengthening their relationships with potential employers.

In addition, we have facilitated training sessions for 15 one-stop center experts and 28 youth association members, covering essential topics such as communication, leadership, management, and decision-making processes.

Finally yet importantly, we are proud to announce the formation of two youth associations in Hawassa Zurya Woreda, focusing on horticulture. These talented and ambitious youths have already begun preparing their farming land, with the support of basic working materials provided by ESD.
